

ADMINISTRATORS COUNCIL
Meeting of Thursday, April 27, 2023
Minutes

1. Attendance. Chancellor Lui Hokoana convened the meeting of the Administrators Council at 11:08 a.m., in the Chancellor's Conference Room. Participating in the meeting were: Vice Chancellor Kahele Dukelow; T. Karen Hanada; Interim Vice Chancellor Kulamanu Ishihara; Brian Moto; Laura Nagle; and Vice Chancellor David Tamanaha. Also present for the latter half of the meeting were Tonya M. Drake, Ph.D., Chancellor & Regional Vice President, Western Governors University, and Jeanette Dillon, Faculty, WGU.
2. Card Key Project. David Tamanaha discussed the campus card key system replacement project. It was suggested that project implementation be scheduled for fall 2023.
3. UH Alert Emergency Notification System. David Tamanaha reported that UH will replace UH Alert with a new software system.
4. High School Recruitment and Registration. Kulamanu Ishihara reported on recruitment activities at Maui High School. Kahele Dukelow discussed the expo at Maui High School, which was held last week.
5. Graduation. Kulamanu Ishihara discussed the script for the graduation ceremony.
6. Legislature. The Council discussed bills relating to UH funding. David Tamanaha discussed the possibility of additional Security positions and the need for expanded offices.
7. Western Governors University. The Council met with representatives of Western Governors University. WGU focuses on educating working adults, especially those working, or desiring to work, in high-need workforce careers, through online delivery of classes. Students pay a flat rate tuition (about \$3,600 for six months). Some wrap around services are provided. WGU uses a different faculty model, with faculty specializing in one of four areas. Courses are completed on a competency basis. All instruction and services are provided online. WGU offers cohorts and guided pathways. WGU does not have electives. WGU has an articulation partnership with Leeward Community College and is working on an agreement with Hawai'i Community College. WGU has four colleges: Education; IT; Health; and Business. WGU national enrollment is about 130,000. Its Hawai'i enrollment is about 3,500. WGU is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities.
