


ACKNOWLEDGE KINDNESS

COVID-19 UPDATES

Please continue to be vigilant, wear your masks when you are around people, follow all COVID protocols, and please get vaccinated and get a booster when it's your time to get one. Stay safe and healthy!

NEW RETURN TO CAMPUS POLICY – After testing positive for COVID-19, in accordance with **CDC isolation guidelines**, UHMC recommends students, faculty, and staff take an antigen test after DAY FIVE (5) of isolation prior to returning to campus. If the test is positive, UHMC students, faculty and staff are required to finish the 10-day isolation period. Free antigen tests are available on campus at testing clinics (see **maui.hawaii.edu** for weekly hours) or by appointment at the Campus Health Center – please 984-3493.

UPDATED FREE COVID TESTING THIS WEEK – Open to the public – Monday (today), Feb. 7th and Thursday, Feb. 10th – 8:00 to 9:30 a.m. and 4:00 to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday, Feb. 12th from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m. at the Community Services Building. We will continue this Monday and Thursday schedule through the end of February. Please call 808-984-3799 with questions or for more information.

If you are a student and you need to be tested, you may call the Campus Health Center at 984-3493 and they will schedule an appointment for you. If you have medical insurance, please bring your medical card and ID when you come for testing. But you do not need medical insurance to get a test. The testing is free.

The Campus Health Center will also be conducting vaccination clinics on Friday, Feb. 11th and Friday, Feb. 18th from 9:00 a.m. to 4:0 p.m. We plan to offer J&J, Moderna, and Pfizer for first, second and Booster doses. The Pfizer we carry is for ages 12 and older; Moderna and J&J is for ages 18 and older.

These clinics are open to the public as well as to all UHMC students, faculty, and staff. In order to keep patients and staff safe, **APPOINTMENTS ARE NECESSARY**. Please call 984-3493.

<u>BOOSTER ELIGIBILITY</u> – Everyone 18 years and older who has been vaccinated with either Moderna or Pfizer at least <u>five</u> months ago OR has been vaccinated with Johnson & Johnson at least <u>two</u> months ago is eligible for the booster.

We accept most insurance but there is no cost to the patient for those without insurance.


