FREE COVID TESTING THIS WEEK – Open to the public – Monday (today), Jan. 24^h and Thursday, Jan. 27th – 8:00 to 9:30 a.m. <u>and</u> 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. at the Community Services Building. We will continue this Monday and Thursday schedule through the end of February. Please call 808-984-3799 with questions or for more information.

If you are a student and you need to be tested, you may call the Campus Health Center at

984-3493 and they will schedule an appointment for you. If you have medical insurance, please bring your medical card and ID when you come for testing. But you do not need medical insurance to get a test. The testing is free.

Our Campus Health Center continues to administer <u>VACCINES</u>. First, second and booster shots are available. We have all three vaccines – Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson.

<u>BOOSTERS</u> – Everyone 18 years and older who has been vaccinated with either Moderna or Pfizer at least <u>five</u> months ago OR has been vaccinated with Johnson & Johnson at least <u>two</u> months ago is eligible for the booster. We have Pfizer first, second and boosters for adolescents age 12 and up.

The center is open to the public as well as to all UHMC students, faculty, and staff. In order to keep patients and staff safe, **APPOINTMENTS** <u>ARE</u> **NECESSARY**. Please call 984-3493.




ACKNOWLEDGE KINDNESS
